Three years, two careers!

Students who are interested in taking both the Interior Design and Architectural Drafting/Construction Technology programs can do so under the dual offering, referred to as ID-AD, which can lead toward a path to two associate degrees in three years.

The dual degree option maximizes synergies between the Interior Design and Architectural Drafting/Construction Technology programs through the sharing of resources, such as faculty expertise, facilities and community programs. Additionally, those taking ID-AD will graduate with additional skills making them more marketable to both industries.

The dual option features an abbreviated schedule, a diverse environment, and enhanced opportunities for collaboration and networking.

The ID-AD option totals 83 credits, and it is structured to be completed over three years. If the programs were taken separately, the total number of credits for both would total 124, which is a 41-credit difference.

- Prepare for jobs such as:
 - Interior Design: interior design consultant, residential designer, kitchen and bath designer, commercial designer, healthcare designer and sales representative.
 - Architecture: drafter, architectural technician, project assistant, architectural illustrator/modeler,
 3D Visualization Specialist.
- Internship experiences provide technical, hands-on learning in real-world settings and often lead to full-time employment.
- Options for extracurricular activities include participation in the Architectural Club, Interior Design Club, ASID Student Chapter, and/or SkillsUSA.
- Compete in statewide and national industry-specific competitions.
- Biennial international study/tour opportunities expose students to architecture and design in countries throughout the world.
- Opportunities for credits that transfer to other institutions.






Farn two associate degrees in three years!
