## About the Program

Dental assistants perform a variety of patient care, office and laboratory responsibilities. They provide chair-side assistance as dentists examine and treat patients. They make patients as comfortable as possible in the dental chair, prepare them for treatment and obtain their dental records. In this statewide set program, students will also use and care for dental equipment, expose and process radiographs, assist with dental emergencies, record medical and dental information, maintain a supply inventory and perform related dental office and laboratory procedures under the direction and supervision of a dentist.

Learn to take alginate impressions on manikins and clean removable appliances. Prerequisites: 508-101 Dental Health Safety (or concurrent) or 508-300 Dental Theory; and 508-304 Dental & General Anatomy (or concurrent) or 508-102 Oral Anatomy, Embry, Histology		Develop professional appearance and image and learn to work within ethical guidelines and legal frameworks. Develop and customize a portfolio and on-going professional development plan to prepare for the workforce. Prepare to chart oral cavity structures, dental pathology, and restorations and assist a dentist with basic dental procedures including examinations, pain control, amalgam restoration, and cosmetic restoration. Develop the ability to educate patients about preventive dentistry, brushing and flossing techniques, and dental procedures, using lay terminology. Apply decoding strategies to the correct use and interpretation of dental terminology. Prerequisites: 508-101 Dental Health Safety (or concurrent) or 508-300 Dental Theory; and 508-113 Dental Materials (or concurrent); and 508-306 Dental Assistant Clinical (or concurrent); and 508-307 Dental Assistant Professional (or concurrent); and 508-305 Applied Dental Radiography (or concurrent); and 508-304 Dental & General Anatomy (or concurrent) or 508-300 Dental Theory

Apply fundamentals of general and dental anatomy to informed decision-making and to professional communication with colleagues and patients.			
<b>508-305 Applied Dental Radiography</b>	<b>2</b>		
Operate x-ray units and expose bitewing, periapical, extra oral, and occlusal radiographs. Emphasis on protection against x-ray hazards. Process, mount, and evaluate radiographs for diagnostic value. Demonstrate competency on a manikin in addition to exposing bitewing radiographs on a peer, role-play patient. Prerequisites: 508-101 Dental Health Safety (or concurrent) or 508-300 Dental Theory; and 508-304 Dental & General Anatomy (or concurrent) or 508-300 Dental Theory
