

Medical scholarships awarded to area students

Eleven students seeking higher education in medical- or health-related fields were each awarded a \$1,000 scholarship for the 2009-10 school year by the Oconomowoc Memorial Auxiliary Scholarship committee.

To receive the scholarship, the student must live in the area serviced by Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital, attend a state school and maintain a 2.75 grade point average in a medical field.

The Marti Klug Scholarship was granted to Lyndsey Rein of Watertown, who will enter her junior year working toward a bachelor of science degree in nursing at Concordia University-Mequon.
