PRE-NURSING

29 credits toward the 65-credit Associate Degree in Nursing

Nurses are key to the healthcare team, serving as caregivers, educators and patient advocates. Licensed nurses may work in hospitals, clinics, long-term care facilities or on the business side of healthcare.

Upon successful completion of the pre-Nursing coursework and admission to the nursing program, qualified students may petition for a seat. If a seat is awarded, students take the additional 38 credits of core Nursing courses to complete their Nursing degree.

WCTC'S DUAL ENROLLMENT ACADEMY (DEA) is designed to give high school students a jump start in high-demand occupations, awarding participants with a WCTC credential(s) upon successful completion along with earning high school credits. High school students will spend the majority of their school day, both the fall and spring semesters, at WCTC participating in DEA.

To be eligible for the Pre-Nursing DEA, students must:

- Be of Junior status in their first year of the two-year program. Consideration will be made for seniors based on availability.
- 2. Have completed one year of high school Chemistry with a C or better each semester prior to starting senior year.
- 3. Complete Health Requirements and Criminal Background checks upon acceptance

Next Steps

- 1. Meet with your High School Counselor/Dual Enrollment Coordinator to see if you qualify for WCTC DEA.
- 2. Attend a Dual Enrollment Informational Session at WCTC.
- 3. Complete the Accuplacer college placement exam for Reading and Writing.
- 4. Complete a WCTC Dual Enrollment Academy Application and submit it to your High School Counselor/Dual Enrollment Representative for approval prior to the posted deadline.
