POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Dental Assistant, Orthodontic Assistant

Dental assistants perform a variety of patient care, office and laboratory responsibilities. In this program, learn to use dental equipment, expose and process radiographs, assist with dental emergencies, record medical and dental information, maintain a supply inventory, and perform related dental office and laboratory procedures under the direction and supervision of a dentist.

Dental hygienists perform educational, preventive and therapeutic dental services that are consistent with providing optimal oral health. These services may include sealants, fluoride treatments, non-surgical periodontal therapies and radiographic images.

Health Information Technology

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Coder/Abstractor, Revenue Cycle Analyst, Discharge Analyst, Health Record Analyst

Health information technicians contribute to the quality of care by collecting, analyzing and reporting healthcare data while protecting the integrity and security of patient health information. In this program, gain knowledge of disease processes and treatments, data and information standards, regulatory and ethical issues, and application of organizational management skills.

Medical Coding Specialist

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Medical Coding Specialist, Revenue Cycle Analyst, Medical Billing Specialist, Medical Coder

Learn to review physician documentation in order to assign diagnoses and procedure codes used for reimbursement and data reporting purposes. Explore anatomy, disease processes, diagnosis and procedure code sets, and systems to report healthcare data for reimbursement and statistical analysis in settings including hospitals, physician's offices, healthcare and insurance organizations.

Human Services Associate

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Case Manager, Community Resource Specialist, Human Services Technician

Human services professionals provide resources, counsel and assistance to individuals in an effort to improve their quality of life. In this program, develop and practice direct client care, treatment, rehabilitation, education and behavioral direction to individuals or groups. Learn behavioral rehabilitation techniques, counseling methods, ethics and family systems. Those in this field work closely with social workers, psychologists and counselors.

LPN to RN Nursing Bridge

If you are already working as a Licensed Professional Nurse (LPN) and are interested in becoming a Registered Nurse (RN), this bridge program can help you reach your goal sooner.

By completing specific bridge courses, you are able to enter the Nursing - Associate Degree program at the third semester based on past education and experience. This personalized progression pathway will help you become an RN with minimal repetition of the skills and knowledge you've already learned.

Master Aesthetician

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Aesthetician, Skin Care Specialist, Paramedical Aesthetician, Oncology Aesthetician, Makeup Artist

Go beyond the basics of aesthetics by learning skills to perform in spa and medical spa environments. This program provides training in classic spa and waxing treatments, lash services and advanced skin treatments, including hands-on laser, intense pulsed light (IPL) and micro needling training. Train to work in plastic surgery, dermatology, medical spas and other medical environments..

Medical Interpreter for Healthcare

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Medical Interpreter, Language Services Specialist, Interpreter, Lab Scheduler/Spanish Bilingual

Medical interpreters facilitate communication between limited English-speaking patients and their healthcare providers, to convey accurate messages about health and wellness. Learn to provide medical language interpretation for Spanish-speaking patients and families. Interpreters are skilled in spoken and written translation and interpretation, nonverbal communication and nuances of various dialects and subcultures.

Nursing - Associate Degree

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Staff Nurse, Charge Nurse/Supervisor, Public Health or School Nurse, Forensic Nurse, Home Care Nurse, Nurse Educator

Nurses are key to the healthcare team, serving as caregivers, educators and patient advocates. Integrate the science and art of nursing to prepare for the national licensing exam to become a registered nurse. Licensed nurses may work in hospitals, clinics, long-term care facilities or on the business side of healthcare.

Nursing Assistant (CNA)

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Nursing Assistant, Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Learn fundamental nursing assistant skills through lectures, demonstrations and skills practice in this 75-hour program. After mastering the skills, complete training in a nursing home or hospital setting under the supervision of an instructor. A Certified Medication Assistant course is available for qualified CNAs.

Phlebotomy Technician

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Donor Specialist, Medical Laboratory Technician, Phlebotomist, Phlebotomy Technician

A phlebotomy technician's primary responsibility is drawing blood and conducting other specimen collections. They must recognize conditions that might alter collections, correlate types of lab tests to the written diagnosis, and communicate with the lab and patients. Learn to draw blood from a patient for laboratory analysis, understand lab test requirements and maintain specimen quality.

Sterile Processing Technician

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Central Service Technician, Instrument Technician, Processing Technician

Sterile processing technicians provide patient care services in the healthcare facility by maintaining the equipment and supplies used in hospital and clinical settings. Learn the principles, procedures and skills needed to process, package, sterilize and distribute tools and equipment used in surgery and other patient care areas.



Substance Use Disorder Counseling

POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Substance Abuse Counselor (SAC), Recovery Support Specialist, Addictions Counselor, Case Manager

Prepare to work with people experiencing substance use disorders by developing skills in counseling, addiction assessment, case management/treatment planning, group facilitation, trauma-informed care and crisis management.

Surgical Technology

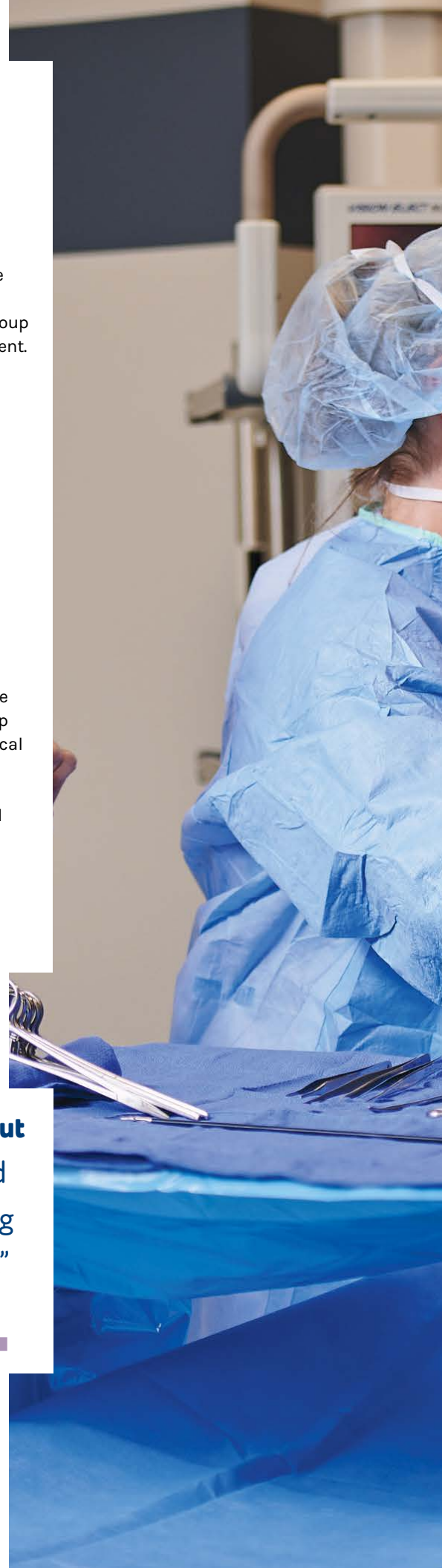
POTENTIAL CAREERS:

Surgical Technologist, Surgical First Assistant, Surgical Equipment Sales Representative

The surgical technologist's primary task is to assist the surgeon in the operating room. In this program, develop knowledge in human anatomy, microbiology and medical terminology, and learn to identify and handle surgical instruments and equipment. Spend time in a hospital operating room to apply knowledge and skills in actual surgical conditions.
