Autism for Educators | 9 credits

Learn characteristics, strategies and techniques to promote educational and social success in individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). This certificate is designed for educators and paraprofessionals interested in learning how to support individuals with ASD in classroom settings.

Child Care Administrator Credential (Wisconsin) | 18 credits

Take an in-depth look at effective leadership in early childhood settings. Explore topics including organizational management, administration, policy, marketing, financing, child development and advocacy in the early childhood field. This credential meets licensing and Registry requirements for administering a child care center.

Developmental Disabilities | 12 credits

Develop skills to work with individuals with developmental disabilities and prepare for entry-level work in residential counseling, group home management, shelter workshop assisting and other direct care roles. Learn counseling and behavior modification techniques, and explore disability types, related health issues and available services.

Family Child Care Credential | 12 credits

This program is designed for those planning to provide childcare in a home or family setting. Explore topics including child development, quality standards, community resources, health and wellness, curriculum planning and family partnerships, among others. Upon completion, you'll be prepared to earn The Registry Family Child Care Credential.

Inclusion | 15 credits

Explore methods to better support and work with students with disabilities in K-12 school settings. Develop skills to work with school and Individualized Education Plan (IEP) teams to provide meaningful, student-centered accommodations. Learn to implement a wide variety of learning approaches for students with emotional and behavioral differences.

Infant Toddler Credential | 12 credits

Learn to provide quality care for infants and toddlers, from birth to age 2 ½. Learn how to plan and implement programs that promote language, cognitive, physical, social and emotional development. Develop specific methods to strengthen child-family connections and explore health- and safety-related quality issues within child care settings. WI Registry recognized.

Instructional Strategies | 16 credits

Learn the skills needed to work as an instructional assistant, supporting children with diverse educational needs in math, science, reading and language arts. Explore best practices related to common core and other educational standards.
