

## CDL Class A Technical Diploma

### Getting Started

#### Step 1 Confirm your program choice

- You are encouraged to contact the Truck Driving Hotline at 262.691.5502 or email us at truckdriving@wctc.edu to receive detailed information. WCTC Truck Driving instructors will be available to answer questions regarding eligibility, course offerings and program requirements.

#### Step 2 Create a student account, if you do not have one

- Go to [www.wctc.edu/create-account](http://www.wctc.edu/create-account) to create an instant account or call 262.691.5578.

#### Step 3 Attend a mandatory Truck Driving Information Session

- Sign up online at [www.wctc.edu/truck](http://www.wctc.edu/truck).

#### Step 4 Schedule and complete a Department of Transportation (DOT) Physical DL Check

- WCTC will accept a DOT Medical Card from any approved DOT medical site. Approved physicians can be found at: [nationalregistry.fmcsa.dot.gov/NRPublicUI/home.seam](http://nationalregistry.fmcsa.dot.gov/NRPublicUI/home.seam) (web address is case sensitive).
- Contact individual medical sites for DOT physical pricing information.
- Once the DOT physical is complete, email your contact information (phone number, etc.), a copy or scan of the Federal Medical Examiner Certificate (Fed Med Card) and a copy or scan of your current driver license to truckdriving@wctc.edu.
- The WCTC Truck Driving department will verify your valid Class D driver's license and Fed Med Card, before course registration permits are issued.

#### Step 5 Schedule and complete a DOT drug screen within 30 days prior to class start

- WCTC will accept a DOT drug screen from any approved DOT medical site. Approved physicians can be found at: [nationalregistry.fmcsa.dot.gov/NRPublicUI/home.seam](http://nationalregistry.fmcsa.dot.gov/NRPublicUI/home.seam) (web address is case sensitive).
- Contact individual medical sites for DOT drug screen pricing information.
- Once the DOT drug screen is complete, the DOT medical facility must email the results directly to truckdriving@wctc.edu
- This MUST be done within 30 days prior to the start of class. We will send a reminder to those at 15 days prior that have not completed this requirement. If this requirement is not met, you will be removed from the roster. IF you attend class the first day and this is not met, you will lose 20% of the cost of Truck Driving as a profession.

**Please Note:** The WCTC Truck Driving program prepares students for the Commercial Driver License (CDL) skills exam which is required to obtain the Class A, with air brakes, CDL. Visit [www.cristcdl.com](http://www.cristcdl.com) for practice CDL tests. Students must have a valid driver's license and a good driving record. Students must be 18 years of age; 21 years of age to drive commercially out of the state.

A CDL learner's permit is required prior to beginning course **458-345 Truck Driving - Road Experience**. A CDL learner's permit course will be available if additional assistance is needed in passing the permit test. Call the Truck Driving Hotline for fee information.

# Truck Driving – Frequently Asked Questions

## How will this program prepare me for a career?

- The program prepares you to become a professionally trained Truck Driver and test for the Wisconsin Class A Commercial Driver’s License (CDL).
- Training is provided by experienced and knowledgeable instructors with years of field and classroom teaching experience. During the behind the wheel instruction the typical instructor ratio is 3 students per 1 instructor.

## What does the program cover?

- Classroom training is designed to introduce the rules and regulations as they relate to commercial vehicle driving and safe handling techniques. How to properly inspect vehicles, complete map reading and trip planning, and employment outlook will also be covered.
- Yard skills training will cover orientation and introduction to the vehicle. Practice maneuvering, gear-shifting, backing, and stopping behind-the-wheel of WCTC tractor-trailers.
- Road skills training will provide students opportunities to practice lane changes, turns, shifting, and uphill/downhill driving. Students will be evaluated after each driving session.
- At the conclusion of skills training the student will test with the Wisconsin DOT to obtain a CDL-A driving license. Testing fee includes WCTC Truck and Trailer and is completed onsite.

## Where is the training held?

- Training is held at the WCTC Pewaukee Campus; 800 Main Street, Pewaukee, WI 53072 in the T Building.

## What is the employment outlook?

- According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of truck drivers is projected to grow 11% from 2012 to 2022. As the economy grows, the demand for goods will increase, and more truck drivers will be needed to keep supply chains moving.
